Note the German Translations of [I Samuel 1:20; 2:16](#)
The verse in chapter two is quite unusual; what is its meaning?

Reading: [I Samuel 1:20; 11-17](#)

We see in verses 11-17 of the 2nd chapter, some young men’s sins that were “*very great before the Lord*”; the sons of Eli the priest are clearly presented here as “*worthless men*” who were willing to take by force meat for sacrifice that was required to first undergo the proper procedure; these men had no respect for [“*...dispised...*”] “*...the offering of the Lord.*”

Reading: [Psalm 106:15](#) – This verse shows a principle: After the period of the Judges, the people clamored for a king as other nations had, against His will; so the Lord granted their request, but *not the result they expected* in their wrong desire.
