APOSTLE – Defined

The Greek noun ἀπόστολος means "an ambassador", "one who is sent" – a delegated authority; ἀπόστολος is a compound word from $A\pi o$, meaning from, and $\sigma \tau \in \lambda \lambda o$, meaning send. The cognate verb is ἀπόστελλω, meaning to send out.

An apostle of Jesus Christ was the highest official in the local churches (I Cor. 12:28).

Apostleship was a spiritual gift, sovereignly bestowed by the Holy Spirit at the point of salvation.

The original apostles were already saved, and received their Spiritual gift on the day of Pentecost (<u>I Cor. 12:11</u>; <u>Eph. 4:11</u> and <u>I Cor. 12:28</u>).
