Current Unit: Fruit of the Spirit

Lesson 3: Patience

Bible Verse: Ephesians 4:2b *"Be patient, bearing one another in love."*

Bible Passage: Book of Jonah, Chapters 1 and 2

Applications:

- 1) As God was patient with Jonah, so is He patient with all Believers, waiting patiently for us to remember Him in prayer.
- 2) As Jonah's prayer to God admitting his rebellion restored him to fellowship, so Believers can be restored to fellowship and be fruitful by naming their sins to the Lord in prayer. 1 John 1:9
- 3) As the Lord redirected Jonah to Nineveh to fulfill His plan, so will He direct us through the Holy Spirit to be fruitful.

Bible Verse: Ephesians 4:2

1. Everyone said the Bible verse from memory. Good job!
2. To review the story of Jonah, students presented a stick puppet show with puppets made in a previous class. Everyone told part of the story and responded to questions.
3. We recalled Jonah's sins and consequences in chapter 1, ie. disobedience, laziness, harm to sailors and himself, his rebound and thanksgiving in Chapter 2, his obedience and consequential salvation of Nineveh

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in chapter 3. We also analyzed his mental attitudes in chapter 4, ie. anger over the Lord's forgiveness of Nineveh, hatred of people of Nineveh, pride and unforgiveness.

This Sunday we will culminate our lessons on Patience.

Objectives:

1. Review Jonah's story emphasizing Jonah's impatience, and the Lord's patience in giving Jonah a second chance to obey.
2. Understand meaning of five sins that began in Jonah's mind: disobedience, anger, hatred, pride and unforgiveness
3. Match the five sins with five thoughts which caused Jonah to be out of fellowship with the Lord.
