

## Deity, Humanity - Hypostatic

- I. Deity II – became the God-Man
- II. Totally God – Totally Man
- III. When God became man – Deity did not vanish – no Deity characteristics were lost.
- IV. In His humanity, He did not choose to use deity characteristics for personal glory.
- V. He relied upon the Holy Spirit and the power of the Word. [Luke 2:40, 52](#); [Matthew 4](#), [Isaiah 11:2](#)
- VI. His thoughts while in the body were determined by His relationship to the Father.

TWO WORDS ARE VERY IMPORTANT – SCHEMA (σχῆμα) fashion. [1 Cor. 7:31](#) – overt likeness AND MORPHE (μορφή) [Phil. 2:7](#) – inner character prior to becoming the God man. He chose to willingly and deliberately “void” the morphe which He rightly possessed as God to be a doulos (δουλός) servant, slave.
