God and Adam

When God created Adam, He gave him the legitimate authority to rule planet earth. When God created Adam, He created him: BODY/SOUL/SPIRIT.

- 1. Adam's HUMAN SPIRIT formed the basis for his relationship with God in the Garden.
- 2. Adam's BODY gave him the basis for logistical provision in time and space.
- 3. Adam's SOUL gave him the basis for volitional decision and true worship of God.

Adam sinned – what happened?

- 1. He surrendered his authority to rule planet earth to Satan.
- 2. His human spirit was removed from his body, causing spiritual death. He could not pass on the human spirit to future generations.
- 3. His body received an old sinful nature which would be genetically transmitted to all future generations.
- 4. His SOUL became corrupted by the OSN but still remained functional. He still had conscience which contained a frame of reference for right and wrong.

Adam's progeny suffered consequences – HOW?

- 1. They would be born spiritually dead sharing the condemnation for Adam's sin.
- 2. They would be born with the indwelling presence of the OSN in the cell structure of their bodies.

- 3. They would be born with a soul, and thus would be able to choose for themselves the course of their lives.
- 4. They would be born with a human conscience, and thus be able to discern right from wrong.

Adam's original sin resulted in spiritual death of the entire human race — except for Adam II — LJC. Christ work on the cross in receiving the imputation of the personal sins of the human race resulted in the opportunity for the human race to regain Spiritual Life in God. Salvation is free — but must be received, taken, and accepted. It is offered to everyone without exception. Salvation AROSE from the sins of ALL being imputed to the ONE! Spiritual Death AROSE from the sins of ONE — being imputed to all. Romans 5:18

- 1. Grace describes post salvation spiritual assets.
- 2. The gift of righteousness is the imputation of Christ's work into the new believer at salvation.
- A judicial sentence handed down by a Judge.
- 4. A death sentence was handed down from God the Father to Jesus Christ. He died under a judicial sentence.
- 5. This is a permanent judicial decision. It lasts for all eternity.
- 6. God will not rescind His judgment of our sins on Jesus Christ.
- We are secure in Him FOREVER.
