LAST JUDGMENT (Great White Throne)

- I. People who do not face God's justice in time will receive Divine Justice in Eternity 2nd Death Great White Throne Judgment (John 5:22).
 - 1. The Last Judgment is the alternative to salvation.
 - 2. God is perfect in Righteousness and Justice.
 - 3. He found a way in time to keep from compromising these two characteristics.
 - 4. Christ did this in Propitiation.
- II. The human race two categories:
 - 1. BELIEVER Perceptive, who has accepted the Lord Jesus Christ, the Good news of the Gospel (John 3:18 "He that believeth is not condemned…").
 - 2. UNBELIEVER Negative, Non-perceptive, One who has rejected Jesus Christ Eternal condemnation (John 3:36 "He that believeth on the Son hath everlasting life: and he that believeth not the Son shall not see life; but the wrath of God abides on him").
- III. In the last Judgment the unbeliever is under indictment, based on rejection of Jesus Christ as Savior (John 16:9 "of sin because they believe not on me"; Revelation 20:15 "Whosoever was not found written in the book of life was cast into the Lake of Fire").
- IV. No believer is involved in the Last Judgment (Romans 8:1).
- V. The Unbeliever has two appointments with God:
 - 1. Death
 - 2. Last Judgment (Hebrews 9:27, 28)
- VI. The second appointment is kept by a 2nd Resurrection (John 5:24-29; Daniel 12:2). God takes all unbelievers, and resurrects them at the end of time after the Gog revolution, for the Great White Throne Judgment.
- VII. The Resurrected unbeliever is condemned on the basis of his human good (works of the flesh) not sin (Revelation 20:12, 13).
- VIII. The Eternal State of the lost is the Lake of Fire forever (Matthew 25:41 "Then he shall say unto them on the left hand, depart from me, ye cursed, into everlasting fire, prepared for the devil and his angels"; Revelation 20:14, 15).
