- Jesus of Nazareth
- The Christ the Anointed One
- The name Jesus is derived from the Hebrew Aramaic word "Yeshua" meaning "Yaweh (the Lord) is salvation.
- Christ comes from the Greek word "Christos" meaning "the Anointed One," "the appointed one" or Messiah in Hebrew.
- > Jesus is the central figure in Christianity. His life, message and ministry are presented in the 4 Gospels of the New Testament.
- > Jesus was from Galilee performed many miracles. He called 12 Jewish men to follow Him, working closely with them to train and prepare them to carry on the ministry.
- ➤ He was conceived of the Holy Spirit, born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, turned water into wine, healed many sick, blind and lame people, forgave sins, multiplied fish and loaves of bread to feed thousands on more than one occasion, delivered demon possessed, walked on water, calmed the stormy sea, raised children and adults from death to life and most of all PROCLAIMED GOOD NEWS OF SALVATION.
- He Laid down his life and was crucified was resurrected from the dead.
- He paid for the sins of the world and purchased pardon redemption for all mankind.
- He restores individuals to fellowship with God.
- He has opened the way of eternal life by His matchless grace.

Jesus - Supreme Majesty (Continued)

- ➤ He was not only fully God, but fully man. He became a human being so that he could identify with our weaknesses and struggles but most of all to reveal that he paid the penalty for the sins of the world. (John 1:1,14; Heb. 2:17; Phil. 2:5-11)
- > To see Jesus you see sacrifice, humility, purity, obedience and devotion.
- He was born in Bethlehem of Judea and grew up in Nazareth in Galilee.
- He is mentioned more than 1200 times in the New Testament.
- His life, message and ministry are recorded in the 4 Gospels.
- His Earthly father was Joseph, a carpenter. He is referred to as a carpenter in Mark 6:3.
- His Heavenly Father God
- His Earthly Father Joseph
- His Mother Mary
- ➤ He had Brothers James, Joseph, Judas and Simon. (Mark 3:31; 6:3; Matthew 12:46; 13:55; Luke 8:19)
- ➤ He had Sisters not named but mentioned in Matthew 13:55, 56 & Mark 6:3.
- ➤ The genealogy of Jesus is found in Matthew 1:1-17; Luke 3:23-37.
