4. Remembering is very important for children and young people. [Eccl. 12: 1](#)
5. Alcoholic beverages are related to a person's mind. [Prov. 31: 4-7](#)
6. Remembering has regret for the lost person. Lost people who go to hell will be able to remember their days here on earth. [Luke 16: 25](#)
7. Remembering is associated with the communication of God's Word. We must keep on remembering who the authority is who teaches us God's Word. He is guarding our souls when he does his job, (teach), and we do ours, (listen). [Heb. 13: 7, 17](#)
8. When a person judges and maligns, he is messing up his memory. [Job 13: 1-12](#)
9. The Word of God must be a part of our memory. Taking in God's Word gives us the true, good things to remember. [II Peter 1: 12-13](#)
10. Memory is important for Christian growth. That is why we go over and over the same teachings at different times. [Psalm 119: 83, 93, 109, 141, 153, 174](#). (This "remembering" is what is important during the Lord's Table.)
