

Paul's Ministry in the Book of Acts

[Acts 21](#) – Paul is in Jerusalem

[Acts 22](#) – he became involved in a mob.

[Acts 23](#) – we see the defense before Sanhedrin

[Acts 24, 25, 26](#) – Rebuke before Felix, Festus, and his defense before Agrippa

[Acts 27](#) – Paul in Rome in AD 61

In Acts 9, we see that Paul is told by the Lord “how much he would suffer” ([Acts 9:15-16](#)).

Paul had some rough times in his life: in [Acts 9:24](#) people plotted to kill him in Damascus, and again in [Acts 9:29](#) people plotted to kill him in Jerusalem. In [Acts 13:50](#) he was driven out of Antioch. In [Acts 14](#), people attempted to stone him in Iconium; in [verse 19](#) of this chapter he was stoned, and left for dead in Lystra. In [Acts 16](#) they beat him with rods in Philippi, and put him in stocks. In [Acts 17](#) the Apostle Paul was mobbed at Thessalonica. Later in the chapter he was driven out of Berea. In [chapter 18](#), people plotted against him at Corinth. In [Chapter 19](#) and confirmed in [2 Corinthians](#), in Ephesus he nearly lost his life at the hands of a mob. In Corinth, shortly after he had written [2 Corinthians](#), the people plotted to kill him; also in Jerusalem they wanted to kill him except for the Roman soldiers ([Acts 22, 23](#)). He was imprisoned 2 years in Caesarea, and 2 more years in prison in Rome.
