Parable of the Prodigal Son

Parable, from the compound word παραβολή.

- 1. Παρα Para, means beside
- 2. Boλή Bole, to throw/cast

Luke 15 in Context

- 1. Jesus had been followed by large crowds as he moved through the city teaching. (Luke 14:25)
- 2. The Pharisees and the Scribes scrutinized Jesus anwere looking to catch him in violation of Mosaic Law. (Luke 14:1-4)
- 3. Jesus was rightfully critical of the Pharisees. (Matthew 23:1-7)
- 4. First two Parables
 - 1. Parable of the Lost Sheep (Luke 15:4-7)
 - Reference to Prophecy. (Isa 53:5,6)
 - The 99 sheep are the respectable Jews, the one is a one who lost that respectability.
 - 2. Parable of the Lost Coin (Luke 15:8-10)
 - Again showing the worth of the lost 1 among the many.
 - Stating the joy found in heaven when one sinner repents.

The Parable of the Lost Son

- 1. "A certain man had two sons" shows that they were a family, one group of people.
- 2. "give me my share" division of the goods to the children established by Law. (Deuteronomy 21:17)

The Prodigal Son (Part I) (Continued)

- 3. "got together all he had, set off for a distant country" he desired to be apart from the authority of the Father.
- 4. "squandered his wealth in wild living" This was not simply being irresponsible with money, but an unbridled willingness to sin.
- 5. "there was a severe famine in that whole country" when we have fallen out of fellowship, God will discipline us to urge us to restore to fellowship. (Prov 3:11,12, Heb 12:7- 12)
- 6. "he went and hired himself out to a citizen of that country" instead of turning to his father, he clung to human solutions.
- 7. "who sent him to his fields to feed pigs" this is hitting rock bottom. Pigs were detestable to the Jewish people.
- 8. "but no one gave him anything" His human solution to his problem was not sustaining him.
- 9. "When he came to his senses" when he had accepted the temptation to sin, he had given over to evil/satanic thinking. In that field he came to his sense and knew he needed the Father. (Ecc. 9:3)
- 10. "I will set out and go back to my father" the son gives three statements he will give to his father.
 - 1. "Father, I have sinned against heaven and against you"
 - 2. "I am no longer worthy to be called your son"
 - 3. "make me like one of your hired servants."
- 11. "while he was still a long way off, his father saw him" the Father was watching, eagerly hoping for the return of his son.
