Prophet's Responsibility

Isaiah 1:1; II Kings 17:13

I. GENERAL

- 1. Prophets WERE men whom God raised up during the dark days of Israel's history.
- 2. They were evangelists of the day (II Kings 17:13).
- 3. The period of the prophets covered five hundred years, from the ninth to the fourth century B.C.
- 4. The voices of the prophets were silenced until John the Baptist came on the scene.
- 5. The office of the prophet was instituted in Samuel's time. When the kingdom was divided and Judah and Israel were established as separate monarchies, the great prophets appeared.
- 6. There were 4 Major and 12 Minor Prophets.
- 7. There are 17 prophetical books in the Old Testament.
- 8. They are subdivided into major and minor, determined by the amount of material written.

II. PROPHETS ACCORDING TO TIME

- 1. 6 prophets lived in the time of Israel's destruction by Assyria Joel, Jonah, Amos, Hosea, Isaiah, and Micah.
- 2. 7 lived in the time of Judah's destruction by Babylon Jeremiah, Ezekiel, Daniel, Obadiah, Nahum, Habakkuk and Zephaniah.
- 3. 3 lived in the time of the restoration to their own land Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi.

III. PROPHETS ACCORDING TO SPECIAL MESSAGES

- 1. 3 to Israel Amos, Hosea and Ezekiel
- 2. 2 to Nineveh Johan and Nahum
- 3. 1 to Babylon Daniel
- 4. 1 to Edom Obadiah
- 5. 9 to Judah Joel, Isaiah, Micah, Jeremiah, Habakkuk, Zephaniah, Haggai, Zechariah and Malachi.

Prophet's Responsibility (Continued)

IV. PROPHET'S MESSAGE

- 1. His chief duty was to deal with the moral and religious life of his own people during his time.
- 2. The prophet was never sent while the nation was walking in obedience to God.
- 3. Their writings are rebukes, because of the bad conditions that existed.
- 4. There was nothing general about the prophet's denunciations.
- 5. The prophet was always a Hebrew.
- 6. He not only spoke of judgment that would come to pass to the people because of their sin but he was also a foreteller of future events primarily related to the nation of Israel.
- 7. Other people (other than Jews) were mentioned only as they came in contact with Israel.

V. PROPHECIES RELATED TO THE FUTURE

- 1. The dispersion and captivity of God's chosen people is emphasized.
- 2. Everywhere, the prophet told that the Jew was to be scattered among the nations of the world.
- 3. They foretold the restoration of the chosen people to their own land under the coming Messiah, David's greater Son.
- 4. The Jew is still looking for his Messiah.
- 5. Every Jew has a longing in his heart to be a part of a great nation.

VI. THE PROPHETS CHARACTER

- 1. The prophets were fearless men.
- 2. They denounced the sins of their day.
- 3. They called people away from idols, and back to God.
- 4. The prophets were concerned about the political corruption and moral decay, but their greatest concern was the wrong attitude toward God, and involvement in idolatry.
- 5. The prophets exposed the cold formalism of their religion.
- 6. They constantly reminded the people that Jehovah was the only true God.
- 7. They were not only "forth-tellers" but "fore-tellers."
- 8. So important is the prophecy in the Bible, it occupies about one third of the whole Bible.
