

SATAN - Names

A common name for Satan in the New Testament is "*the devil*", meaning "slanderer" or "false accuser." Other titles by which Satan is identified in the New Testament include:

"the tempter" ([1 Thess. 3:5](#));

"Beelzebub" ([Matt. 12:24](#));

"the wicked (evil) one" ([Matt. 13:19, 38](#));

"the ruler of this world" ([John 12:31](#))

"the god of this age" ([2 Cor. 4:4](#));

"Belial" ([2 Cor. 6:15](#)),

"the prince of the power of the air" ([Eph. 2:2](#));

and *"the accuser of our brethren"* ([Rev. 12:10](#)).
