SATAN - Names

A common name for Satan in the New Testament is "the devil", meaning "slanderer" or "false accuser." Other titles by which Satan is identified in the New Testament include:

"the tempter" (1 Thess. 3:5);
"Beelzebub" (Matt. 12:24);
"the wicked (evil) one" (Matt. 13:19, 38);
"the ruler of this world" (John 12:31)
"the god of this age" (2 Cor. 4:4);
"Belial" (2 Cor. 6:15),
"the prince of the power of the air" (Eph. 2:2);
and "the accuser of our brethren" (Rev. 12:10).
