## The Word Walk in the NT

## Eph. 2:2

There are 3 words for walk we view in the New Testament – each with a different meaning:

- 1. Anastrepho αναστρέφω used for pattern of social life. In Eph. 2:3 the word is used for conversation
- 2. stoicheo στοιχ'εω This word refers to action along a particular line it means to follow a definite course of action. Rom. 4:12; Phil. 3:16.
- 3.  $Peripateo \pi \epsilon \rho \iota \pi \alpha \tau \dot{\epsilon} \omega$  used in Eph. 2:2 and means a person or an individual going about, walking around. (Note here the Greek/literal translation of verse 2)

"In which you formerly walked according to the age of this world (κοσμος), according to the ruler (ἀρχόν) highest ruler-Satan."

Note: Satan did not inherit the world, but he SEIZED it.
